

PRAYING FOR OUR LEADERS (REDUX)

I. [1 Timothy 2:1-4](#) [Titus 3:1-2](#) [1 Peter 2:13-17](#)

A. From 54 AD to 68 AD, Rome was ruled by Claudius Caesar Augustus Germanicus, a.k.a. Nero... (Here's a brief summary of Nero's rule...)

- 1) History does not look kindly upon him.
- 2) His reign is best described as one of extravagance and tyranny.
- 3) Initially he was very popular among the lower class.
- 4) He built theaters, promoted athletic events, even raced chariots himself, though some claim he bribed the judges just to win.
- 5) Some record that he craved attention, was obsessed by popularity.
- 6) He wrote poetry, played the lyre, sang publicly (perhaps not well).
- 7) He won a war, negotiated peace with the Parthian Empire, improved diplomatic relations with Greece, started the first Roman-Jewish War which would be finished by a successor with the fall of Jerusalem in 70 AD.
- 8) Nero, many believe, torched Rome and perhaps played his lyre as it burned for 5 or 6 days. (*17th century saying: Nero fiddled while Rome burned.*) He famously blamed the fire on Christians, persecution erupted, and Nero had them beheaded, crucified, fed to wild animals, and covered with pitch and set afire.
- 9) Nero was ruthless--executed his mother, his adopted brother, two wives, and two well known apostles in 68 AD, Peter (crucified upside down) and Paul (beheaded). Nero would take his own life that same year following a coup.
- 10) Through most church history, Nero was considered the antiChrist.

B. In the heart of Nero's reign, God was not silent and He spoke to us through Paul and Peter about relating to our government leaders...

C. [1 Timothy 2:1-4](#) (NIV) Paul writes to Timothy in 64 AD, in the heart of Nero's reign: **1** I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone— **2** for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. **3** This is good, and pleases God our Savior, **4** who wants all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.

D. [Titus 3:1-2](#) (NIV) Likewise Paul writes to Titus during this same time period:

1 Remind the people to be subject to rulers and authorities, to be obedient, to be ready to do whatever is good, **2** to slander no one, to be peaceable and considerate, and to show true humility toward all men.

E. [1 Peter 2:13-17](#) (NIV) Then Peter exhorts the church: **13** Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every authority instituted among men: whether to the king, as the supreme authority, **14** or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right. **15** For it is God's will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish men. **16** Live as free men, but do not use your freedom as a cover-up for evil; live as servants of God. **17** Show proper respect to everyone: Love the brotherhood of believers, fear God, honor the king.

F. Clearly God has not been silent when it comes to how we should treat our leaders, regardless of how they've come to power. We are urged to:

- 1) Pray for them and be thankful for them...
 - 2) Be subject and obedient to them--ready to do whatever is good...
 - 3) Avoid slander, being peaceable and considerate, showing humility...
 - 4) Show respect, maintain love, fear God, and show honor to the king...
- G. In case you missed the election, we have a new President and Vice President.

You may have voted for the new President or for someone else. Whether you view him as Washington or Nero, we have our instructions from the Lord.

H. [Daniel 2:20-23](#) (NKJV) After God told Daniel the dream that King Nebuchadnezzar had and the interpretation of it: **20** Daniel answered and said: "Blessed be the name of God forever and ever, for wisdom and might are His. **21** And He changes the times and the seasons; He removes kings and raises up kings; He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to those who have understanding. **22** He reveals deep and secret things; He knows what is in the darkness, and light dwells with Him." (Elsewhere in Daniel it says: "...the Most High is sovereign over the kingdoms of men and gives them to anyone He wishes..." (See Daniel 4:17; 25; 32;))

I. Sometimes God changes the heart of a king or leader. Sometimes God uses a bad leader to change the hearts of a nation. All we need to do is look at the kings of Israel and Judah to see some of the ways God works. What has history taught us about the sovereign hand of our Lord? (e.g. John Quincy Adams & Abraham Lincoln.)

J. All this past week there've been confirmation hearings in Congress for potential cabinet members of the newly elected president. Some of the questions are insightful and probing. Some questions are pure political posturing. It

certainly behooves us to be praying as this process unfolds. Remember we are urged to pray for those in leadership, from the president right on down to our mayor.

K. Daniel 4:34-35 (NIV) Following Nebuchadnezzar's 7 years of insanity: 34 At the end of that time, I, Nebuchadnezzar, raised my eyes toward heaven, and my sanity was restored. Then I praised the Most High; I honored and glorified Him who lives forever. His dominion is an eternal dominion; His kingdom endures from generation to generation. **35** All the peoples of the earth are regarded as nothing. He does as He pleases with the powers of heaven and the peoples of the earth. No one can hold back His hand or say to Him: "What have You done?"

L. Remember this: No election changes what we as believers are called to do--live out The Great Commandment and carry out The Great Commission. Love and the Gospel remain our purpose. This is true for Christians in America but also true for Christians in Russia and China and Mexico and Ghana and all around the globe.

M. Before I close us out with prayer, I have a confession to make. While most of you won't remember, I preached this very same sermon previously, 8 years ago in November 2008, right after the election of President Barack Obama. The words are as true for us now as they were then.

Proverbs 24:21-22 (ESV)

21 My son, fear the Lord and the king, and do not join with those who do otherwise, **22** for disaster will arise suddenly from them, and who knows the ruin that will come from them both?

Jeremiah 29:4-7 (NIV)

4 This is what the Lord Almighty, the God of Israel, says to all those I carried into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: **5** "Build houses and settle down; plant gardens and eat what they produce. **6** Marry and have sons and daughters; find wives for your sons and give your daughters in marriage, so that they too may have sons and daughters. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer. **5** Therefore one must be in subjection, not only to avoid God's wrath but also for the sake of conscience. **6** For because of this you also pay taxes, for the authorities are ministers of God, attending to this very thing. **7** Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, honor to whom honor is owed.

Psalms 146 (NIV)

1 Praise the Lord. Praise the Lord, O my soul. **2** I will praise the Lord all my life; I will sing praise to my God as long as I live. **3** Do not put your trust in princes, in mortal men, who cannot save. **4** When their spirit departs, they return to the ground; on that very day their plans come to nothing. **5** Blessed is he whose help is the God of Jacob, whose hope is in the Lord his God, **6** the Maker of heaven and earth, the sea, and everything in them--the Lord, who remains faithful forever. **7** He upholds the cause of the oppressed and gives food to the hungry.
